Class descriptions

Attending an Oregon OSHA class helps you gain important knowledge and skills. The certificate should not be considered formal Oregon OSHA certification of professional competencies or qualifications. All classes are scheduled for 4 hours. 2

Accident Investigation

You will learn why accident investigations are important and the process for conducting one. This how-to class builds on the basic introduction into the role and purpose of Safety Meetings and Committees.

Bloodborne Pathogens

You will learn about the bloodborne pathogens rule and written exposure control plan. Topics will include basic information about routes of exposure, disease processes, control measures, and training requirements.

Confined Space Safety

You will learn about the definition of a confined space and a permit-required confined space, hazards, alternative procedures to control atmospheric hazards, the written program, and entry permit system.

Excavation Safety

You will learn about the role of the competent person, planning considerations, specific hazards resulting from excavation work, requirements for protective systems, and Oregon OSHA's soil-classification methods.

Fall Protection

This class will discuss the Oregon OSHA rules for fall protection use in the construction industry and will provide specific tools to build a proactive safety program. Falls are consistently one of the top ten injuries in Oregon and cost employers millions of dollars each year. The goal of the class is to increase personal knowledge about how to prevent falls.

Forklift Safety

You will learn about the Oregon OSHA rules for Powered Industrial Trucks and developing a forklift training program. This class does not offer forklift operator certification (cards).

Hazard Communication – Aligned with GHS

You will learn how to write a hazard communication program, complete a chemicals list, conduct employee training, and analyze container labels and Safety Data Sheets (SDS). This how-to workshop guides you through developing and implementing an effective hazard communication program. Provides 3 credits toward recertification of Oregon certified pesticide applicator licenses.

Hazard Identification and Control

You will learn about the types of workplace hazards, hazard correction, developing an inspection checklist for the walk-around inspection, and writing an effective safety inspection report. This class builds on the hazard identification and hazard control modules that are included in Oregon OSHA's introductory class Safety Meetings and Committees.

Hearing Conservation Program

You will learn about the elements of an effective hearing conservation program, what actions can be taken to prevent hearing loss, and signs that noise could be harming hearing.

Heat Illness and Wildfire Smoke (New 2025)

This two-topic workshop reviews the training requirements found in Oregon OSHA's rules, rule exemptions, and industry best practices and advanced hazard analysis methods.

Heat Illness: You will learn about heat-related illnesses with their common signs, symptoms, recommended first aid responses, and risk factors. This class discusses control measures the rules require employers to provide at certain heat index temperatures, such as access to shade and drinking water. You will learn how the heat index is measured and to utilize the heat safety tool app. This class walks you through how to develop and implement a written plan for

acclimatization, and create an example heat illness prevention plan.

 Wildfire Smoke: You will learn about employee's rights, air quality measurements, potential health effects and symptoms of wildfire smoke exposure, and proper usage of filtering facepiece respirators.

Job Hazard Analysis (JHA)

You will learn how to determine which jobs need a JHA, write an effective safe job procedure, and use the JHA to improve safety programs. Conducting JHAs is required for all companies intending to achieve Safety and Health Achievement Recognition Program (SHARP) certification.

Lockout/Tagout and Machine Safeguarding

This two-topic workshop reviews the requirements found in the Oregon OSHA rules, the Control of Hazardous Energy (Lockout/ Tagout), and Machinery and Machine Guarding.

- Lockout/Tagout: You will learn about the purpose and scope of the lockout/tagout standard, lockout and tagout procedures, training criteria, and periodic inspection criteria.
- Machine Safeguarding: You will learn about Oregon OSHA machine guarding requirements, hazardous motions and actions, guards and devices, and training guidelines.

OSHA 300 Recordkeeping

You will learn about reporting requirements, how to fill out the OSHA forms, determine if an injury or illness should be recorded, evaluate the form, and recognize injury trends and root causes.

Root Cause Analysis

You will learn about several root cause analysis tools and their application in the accident investigation process. A walk-through of an example root cause analysis will be presented.

Safety Leadership

You will learn about the concept of leadership, leadership styles, applying effective recognition and discipline, and developing trust and credibility. Emphasis is on applying leadership to reduce or eliminate safety hazards.

Safety and Health Management Principles

You will learn why a safety and health management system is important, become familiar with the seven core elements of an effective safety and health management program, and learn about best practices and overcoming obstacles.

Safety and the Supervisor

You will learn about costs and benefits of taking corrective action, and the five general safety supervision responsibilities outlined in the Oregon OSHA rules. Through class discussion and group exercises, you learn about leadership that supports safe behaviors and conditions.

Safety Meetings and Committees

This introductory class discusses the role and purpose for the safety meeting and/or committee, employer and employee responsibilities, and safety committee training requirements.

What to Expect from an Oregon OSHA Inspection

You will learn about Oregon OSHA services, employee/employer and compliance officer rights and responsibilities, and how and why inspections are conducted. This class helps take the mystery out of the Oregon OSHA compliance inspection process.

Worker Protection Standard (WPS) – Pesticide Emphasis

Protection for Pesticide Handlers and Workers: You will learn about the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Worker Protection Standard (WPS), along with Oregon OSHA's unique requirements related to the standard. The WPS applies to people who work on farms, in forests, nurseries, greenhouses, or other locations that use pesticides. This class qualifies for 4 "Core" pesticide recertification credits for Oregon Private Pesticide Applicator and Pesticide Apprentices

licenses. Individuals who have an Oregon Commercial Pesticide Applicator, Public Pesticide Applicator, and Pesticide Consultant license are welcome to attend and are eligible to accrue 4 "Other" recertification credits. This workshop includes information on what WPS is and its requirements, the difference between pesticide workers and handlers, the pesticide training requirements for both, decontamination requirements, personal protective equipment, elements of the pesticide label as it pertains to WPS, and how and where workers and handlers are notified about pesticide applications.
