The meeting was called to order by Nathan Taylor.

# **Monthly Accidents and Fatalities Report:**

If there is an accident or fatality incident that you would like more information on let Nathan and Jeff know so we can track it and can discuss once the case is able to be discussed.

The following is preliminary information as reported at the time of the accident intake.

#### **Accidents**

1. September 25<sup>th</sup> Winchester

According to the owner, the employee fell from the roof and hit the ground. When he arrived at the site after being called, the employee was under the care of the ambulance crew with an assumed head injury. The employee was unconscious. The employer observed the ambulance crew cutting the harness off the employee and that there was rope on the ground where the employee fell.

#### 2. September 24<sup>th</sup> Clackamas

Employee was stepping down from the scaffolding using a vertical access ladder when he fell 14 feet. He was wearing his hardhat when he fell and hit his head on the ground below.

### 3. September 22<sup>nd</sup> Aloha

Cut left arm using a skill saw. Using a skill saw while on a roof to cut fascia board when left arm was cut.

### 4. September 22<sup>nd</sup> Portland

A construction jobsite experienced a drive by shooting.

### 5. September 17<sup>th</sup> Salem

Employee was training another employee and a juvenile on how to operate a wood planer. The employee who was training, opened the wood planer to clean it while it was still operating and his glove got caught in the moving parts. This resulted in an amputation of his right hand.

#### **Fatalities**

## 1. September 24th Portland

The employee suddenly collapsed and hit their head. He was standing next to the printer in the main office at the end of his shift when he became dizzy, fell and hit his head. Per Medical Examiner cause of death was heart failure (Cardio Vascular Disease). 47 year old male.

# 2. September 21<sup>st</sup>, Reedsport

Worker was returning from break and collapsed on her was back to her desk. Employee was not exposed to heat or chemicals. Smoke from wildfires has been gone 2 weeks and while there was smoke the air was filtered in the office. 72 year old female.

### 3. September 11<sup>th</sup>, Portland

DUI hit a car then crashed into the manager outside the restaurant at an outdoor table. 36 year old male.

## 4. September 10<sup>th</sup> Beaverton

Employee was walking back from break when he had a heart attack and fell on the ground. He was given CPR and AED by the employer and coworkers. 72 year old male.

# **Anonymous Questions:**

If you have anything you would like to bring up at the meetings and would like to stay anonymous, let Mark Tobiasson or Nathan Taylor know and they will bring it up for you.

Question: Will the new temporary COVID rule require full time safety glasses and gloves on construction projects?

Answer: No.

Question: If employees are riding together in company vehicles but not on the clock, can the face covering requirement be enforced?

Answer: If using a company vehicle the employer can impose that they wear facial coverings, but if it is on non-work time, Oregon OSHA does not have jurisdiction. The company will have to deal with the public complaints though.

# **Case Synopsis:**

Renee reviewed a fatality inspection that occurred in 2019 involving a grapple skidder being used by a municipality. The inspection resulted in 5 serious violations related to the maintenance of the skidder and operator training.

### **Status of Rule Making:**

**Employer Knowledge and Penalty Updates-**

Public comment is open until October 30, 2020.

Manganese has an effective delay date of July 1, 2021.

#### **Infectious Disease** Rule Making:

Oregon OSHA is in the process of creating an emergency temporary rule and a permanent rule on Infectious Diseases. <u>Matt Kaiser</u> is the contact person for this rule.

The draft appendix comments are due by October 8, 2020.

The rule right now will be adopted October 21, 2020 with an effective date of November 1, 2020.

Dave apologized for the technical issues we had during the public hearings. We have never held public hearings this way so we are learning how it works.

#### Round table:

Construction Safety Summit is October 27, 2020. It will be held virtually again and it will be on Large Format and Construction Vehicle Backing and Spotting.
